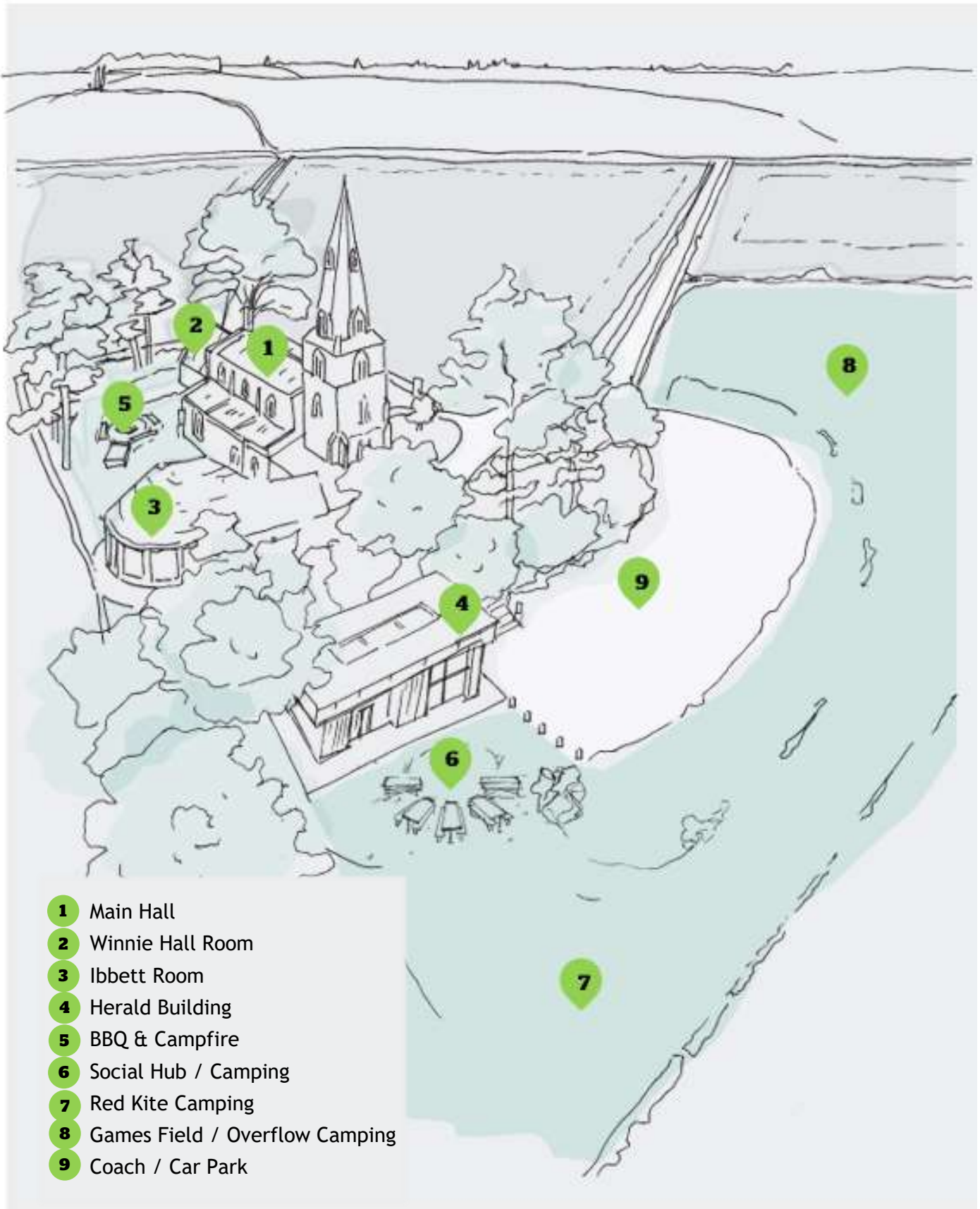


SITE INFORMATION



MAIN HALL

Located in the original nave, this large flexible space (13m x 11m plus the bunkrooms), with a new limestone floor, provides a central focal point for your group to enjoy a range of activities.

The original high ceiling creates fantastic acoustics for musical events and the steps to the chancel form a natural stage with spotlights. Large LED pendant ceiling lights can be dimmed for low-key options along with LED spots in the stone arches.

Tables and chairs can be configured as required for dining, desk-based activities workshops or theatre style (for up to 90 people):

- 14 Gopac tables in Saxon Oak (152 x 76cm), 2 go-pac tables in contour green (122 x 68.5cm)
- 36 padded fold-out chairs set up as standard or up to 90 on request

Our fully equipped modern kitchen has a hatch to the main hall, making it easy for everyone in your group to help.

A table tennis table (foldaway) and table football are stored in the corners of the hall along with equipment trolleys. There are also 4 double power sockets located in each corner of the hall.



WINNIE HALL ROOM

A great space for study, drama, music, teaching, presentations, buffet set up at meal times, playing board games or just chatting and chilling.

Separated from the main hall by large and arched plate-glass doors, the original chancel has been transformed into another flexible activity room (6m x 5m). Up to 30 people can use this large carpeted room yet still be near the main hall activities.

Surrounded by padded benches on three sides, this versatile activity space can easily be adapted to meet your requirements with the addition of chairs or bean bags.

The Winnie Hall room can also be converted into a bedroom for 6 people, with curtains to the main hall for privacy (see Accommodation section). There are also 6 power sockets, 6 USB stations and built-in fan heaters for comfort.



The Winnie Hall Room is named after Edith Winifred ("Winnie") Hall. We are extremely grateful to The Edith Winifred Hall Trust for their unwavering support and generous donations to The Chellington Centre over many years.



IBBETT ROOM

With its spectacular semi-circular wall of windows, the inspiring Ibbett Room brings 180° of sky and countryside into the Centre and offers stunning panoramic views over the Ouse Valley and lakes in the country park below.

This versatile space, 7.5m x 5m in size and carpeted throughout, has great acoustics and is ideal not just as a lounge but for study, drama and music workshops, meetings or as a cinema room (using either the flat screen TV or pull-up white screen, if you have ordered the Media Package).

Great for up to 30, there are 20 padded lounge chairs as a default. It has semi-opaque blinds to all windows and has direct access to the Centre gardens.



ACCOMMODATION

Indoors: sleeps 30-36

The bunkrooms are situated in the old aisles of the church in the main hall. Each room is separated by 4m high oak and formica wall panels topped with thick opaque glass, nearly ceiling-high for privacy. The partition wall facing the hall is 2.5m high and without glass, creating a unique open yet private experience. All but one has leaded windows to the gardens with black out blinds.

All beds are singles, 80cm wide, with deep memory-foam mattresses set in strong and reliable metal and formica frames (similar to a train couchette or ferry experience). Each is crafted around the original features of the stone work, and has its own bed light, shelf, clothing peg and easy access to power sockets. Bag storage is limited; above and under the beds.

The Winnie Hall room, primarily a flexible lounge with built-in sofas, can be readily converted into 6 sofa beds to create an ad hoc bedroom. Each sofa bed is compartmented with oak roll ends and has its own light and power socket with USB charger point; none are elevated. Fan heaters are built into the base of the benches. For privacy, there are curtains inside the plate glass doors to the main hall. The doors swing inwards or outwards.

This space is useful as a leaders' base room, particularly if your group benefits from monitoring with the 'ear' of a leader. There is semi-opaque privacy vinyl up to 2.5m of exterior windows but no blinds currently.

Groups are responsible for making and stripping their own beds. Bedlinen is available to hire. Book under 'Extras' at www.chellington.org/booking

CAMPING

School and youth groups have the option to use our Red Kite campsite and new Herald Building to expand their total numbers up to a maximum of 66. The Chellington team are happy to discuss any configuration of indoor and outdoor accommodation that will help you achieve the objectives of your residential.

The camping setup is perfect for groups looking to offer more independence, either alongside or instead of the indoor accommodation.

The camping is situated close to the main Centre building and to the additional washroom facilities in the Herald Building - 4 toilets, 4 sinks and 4 shower cubicles (including a separate disabled shower/toilet).

You are welcome to bring your own tents or alternatively, 13 tents, sleeping mats and a sturdy gazebo are available to hire.

Tent Rules

Please help us look after our tents by reminding your group of the following tent rules:

1. No shoes in the tent, no socks out of the tent
2. No stepping on the tent
3. Open all the zips to get in and out
4. Always close the zips when you leave the tent
5. No food or drink in the tent, only water



WASH ROOMS

Main Building Washrooms

The Centre washrooms, located to the left of the main corridor, are modern, well-lit and tiled throughout. There are a total of 6 separate toilet cubicles, 4 shower cubicles with sliding locks on the doors, 8 sinks with mirrors and hand-dryer. Hot water is moderated in the washrooms to prevent scalding and is unlimited

There is a separate, fully-accessible bathroom with toilet, shower with seated option, sink and rails etc. Please note there is no hoist.

Toilet rolls are provided (at least 2 in each cubicle), Spares can be found in Cleaning Cupboard in the Entrance Corridor. Toilet brushes and sanitary waste disposal bins are in all toilets. Eco alkaline-balanced hand wash is also provided. A washing ainer is stored between rooms 5 and 6.



Herald Building Washrooms (for camping groups)

Available for groups with camping added to their booking, our state-of-the art shower and toilet block is housed within our new “Herald Building”, also home to our new Charity office.

These washrooms, created for campers, feature 4 toilets, 4 sinks and 4 shower cubicles (including a separate disabled shower/toilet). Hot water is moderated in the washrooms to prevent scalding.



KITCHEN

Our kitchen is equipped with all the modern equipment you need for self-catering for up to 36 (or 66 for bigger groups).

For events, please contact the Chellington team. Although the Centre is primarily a self-catering facility, we have excellent relationships with local caterers and can arrange external catering on request. Just let us know your requirements when booking.

A hatch between the kitchen and main hall allows for easy serving.



Kitchen Facilities

- Large commercial Lincat range with double oven, 6 flat hobs (all electric) and a charcoal fan
- Polar commercial fridge (180 x 60 x 60cm) Freezer (90 x 60 x 60cm)
- Overflow fridge (150 x 60 x 60cm) located between bedrooms 5 and 6 (group must switch on to use) Microwave and grill (24 litre)
- Auto-fill boiling water urn
- Commercial plate/glass polisher (no tablets needed)
- Hot cupboard/plate food warmer
- Spare cupboards for food storage
- Two washing up sinks
- Handwash sink with hand wash provided
- Dualit toaster (5 slice)
- Large kettle

All crockery, cutlery, pans, mugs and cooking utensils etc are provided.
